### Vestry Update

The Vestry would like to extend their thanks to all who participated in the Rector Profile event that was held June 6<sup>th</sup>. After participating in a single blended service where the entire parish celebrated Eucharist together, approximately 100 Calvary members gathered for Spirit filled discussion to determine the attributes that we felt were necessary for our next Rector. Even if you have not yet been able to participate, you can still make a difference, and be part of the process. The Vestry asks all parishioners over the age of 12 to:

### Take the Validation Survey

– this survey is used to determine how well the parishioners agree with the draft versions of the Core Values, Mission Statements, and Vision Statements that have been generated these past few months as part of our Rector pre-search work. You will have the ability to provide feedback and suggestions to the vestry, as well as to provide demographic information that will be used to create our Par-

ish Profile – a document that is given to potential Rector Candidates to give them an idea about the life and people of Calvary. Click on our website [www.calvaryrichmond.org](http://www.calvaryrichmond.org) to take the online survey, which closes July 4<sup>th</sup>.

### Pray for the Vestry as they choose the Search Committee

– The Vestry will gather next Tuesday, June 22, to choose the Search Committee. We have been praying over names, and we ask your prayers for wisdom and discernment to choose members that will look for Rector Candidates that will fit our Core Values, Mission, and Vision.

**Pray for the Search Committee** – as they go through the training process in the next few months that the members will be confident in their abilities and faithful to their mission.

**Recognize** that members of the search committee are giving up their worship time with their families, and honor

their commitment for complete confidentiality during the search process. The search process can take as long as a year, so please be patient. In the meantime, we are truly blessed to have Father Scotty as our interim Rector and Pastor!

Other news:

The Rectory is under contract and scheduled to close on June 18<sup>th</sup>.

The renovation of the Sanctuary is scheduled to begin July 19<sup>th</sup>. In the coming weeks, there will be Saturday work-days scheduled to create temporary storage areas for items necessary for the service. During the renovation, we will not have access to the sanctuary, so if you are a worship or ministry leader, you will need to plan in advance. I hope you are all having a blessed and joyful summer!

# A Parent's Primary Job

Most moms and dads are ready to fight the battle for their children's safety and future as soon as they are born. Parents will buckle them into car seats that fit like plastic strait-jackets, construct beds and play zones with prison bars, hook their arms to an expandable leash to walk through the mall, and install video surveillance systems so their children can be monitored from every room. (I may be guilty of one or all of these!) Parents are programmed to protect and provide. We feel responsible to make sure we have the kind of boundaries that will keep children safe. Over time parents become convinced their primary job is protection, so we make rules, set limits,

and put up fences because that is what we are supposed to do. We are parents. We will insulate, isolate, and segregate our kids from everything we think might be a threat. It is easy for us to become more concerned about their safety than we do their faith. It is possible to sacrifice the very things they need to learn and the things they should experience by our zeal to protect them. But living this way and parenting this way demands the question: What happens one day when they are on their own? when they leave for college? when they enter the working world? when they get married? when they are challenged to sacrifice for the sake of others? They were meant to be a part of an

adventurous story. This is a mission that requires them to engage with culture in order to rescue a generation of hurting and disconnected people. If you are a parent remember this: The family and church were not primarily designed to protect children, but to set them free to demonstrate God's love to a broken world. We, as parents should strive to not separate our children from the world, but to give them the tools to take on God's adventure for them in the world.

## Are you prepared for Hurricane Season?? June 1— Nov. 30

### From the Texas Division of Emergency Management Hurricane Preparedness Guidelines

**Evacuation Planning:** When a hurricane threatens, listen for instructions from local officials. When they call for an evacuation in your area, get going without delay.

- ⇒ Discuss evacuation plans with your family **BEFORE** hurricane season June 1— Nov. 30. Make a checklist of what you need to do before you leave town and review it.
- ⇒ Monitor NOAA weather radio and local TV and radio broadcasts during storm season.
- ⇒ Prepare an emergency supply kit including: radio, flashlight, extra batteries, extra eye glasses, bottled water, non-perishable food, dry clothes, bedding, insurance information documents, medications, copies of prescriptions and special products for babies, the elderly and medically fragile family members.
- ⇒ Learn evacuation routes before storm season. When there's a hurricane in the Gulf, keep your gas tank as full as possible. Expect traffic delays in an evacuation.
- ⇒ **Dial 2-1-1 to register if you have special health care needs or if you simply do not have transportation:** Gulf coast residents in evacuation zones with special health care needs—who do not have friends or family to help—should register in advance for a ride by dialing 2-1-1 in advance. Residents with no other transportation can register for a ride in advance by dialing 2-1-1.
