Vestry news

We are about halfway through the pre-search work that is necessary to complete before we are able to form a search committee for our new rector. We have our Draft Core Values and Mission Statement, and within a month, we will have our draft Vision Statement, and will have contributed our ideas for what characteristics we want in our new Rector. Here is how you can be a part of the process.

Visioning Event: Your voice is important, and we encourage all parishioners age 12 and over to participate in our Visioning Event being held Saturday, May 15th in the Family Life Center from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm. Childcare will be available. We will be deciding where we, as a Congregation, want to take Calvary in the next 3 to 5 years – where do we want to concentrate our efforts? Please RSVP for this important event, so that we will have enough supplies and seating arrangements for your comfort. You may respond via our website at www.calvaryrichmond.org, or

by emailing Vickie Brewster VBrewster@ces-richmond.org with the number and name of participants, as well as the names and ages of the children for childcare.

Rector Profile Event: Sunday, June 6th, after a 9 am blended service. At this event, we will first gather as a Parish for Eucharist at 9 am - only one service on this day. Afterward, we will head into the Family Life Center for a brunch, followed by a workshop where we discuss and determine the attributes that we think our next Rector should possess. Again, all are encouraged to participate, and childcare will be available for the workshop portion of the event.

Validation Survey: This survey is conducted to see how well you, as a parishioner, agree with the Draft Core Values, Mission Statement, and Vision Statement. On this survey there will be places for you to comment and make suggestions. We will also use the survey to

gather demographic information that is useful for making our Parish Profile, which will be sent to all potential Rector Candidates. Of course, we hope that all parishioners will take this process seriously, and thoughtfully complete their surveys.

Expect to see this survey in mid-June, where it will be posted on the website for reply. Arrangements will be made for those without email access.

Photo Directory: Although this is not a part of the pre-search process, it is nonetheless important! What a gift we will present to our new rector by having an up to date photo directory with every family having a corresponding picture. Is It Possible To Overparent?

Is it just me or does it seem parents these days put more pressure on kids than ever before?

- We push them to walk by age 1.
- We desire they excel at a sport by age 9.
- We calculate grade point averages and start talking about scholarships by 6th grade.
- We want them to not only master the English language but learn a few others before they graduate.

I heard a message by Andy Stanley where he talked about how these days we're tempted to raise kids who are experience rich but relationally poor. In other words they've attended every camp, played every sport, mastered most of the arts, played three instruments, but they were so busy they never had the opportunity to just sit around

the kitchen table.

I'm worried that sometimes in our effort to give our kids what we didn't have we rob them of one of the most important things we can give them...ourselves.

I read an interesting article in Time magazine entitled "[The Growing Backlash Against Overparenting](#)".

They said...

Since the onset of the Great Recession, according to a CBS News poll, a third of parents have cut their kids' extracurricular activities. They downsized, downshifted and simplified because they had to — and often found, much to their surprise, that they liked it. When a TIME poll last spring asked how the recession had affected people's relationships with their kids, nearly four times as many people said relationships had gotten better as said they'd gotten worse.

How ironic that we might actually become better parents creating a richer family with less money and fewer opportunities.

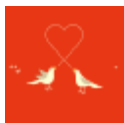
Calvary music groups are open to all...
