LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Introduction Week Three

The first candle we lit was to help us remember that we always need to watch for Christ's coming, filled with hope. The second candle was to remind us that we are to prepare ourselves spiritually by turning from our sin - for Christ is coming and he will bring us peace. This third candle that we will light today reminds us that Christ has set us free, filled us with joy, and called us to carry his message to the world. This Sunday is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means rejoice. Pink is the liturgical color of joy, and so we have a pink candle to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus, the son of God.

Reading Week Three

Now as we light the third candle on our Advent wreath let us reflect on the prophet Isaiah's promise that, as ransomed children of the Lord, we will have everlasting joy and gladness. Before Jesus came to the earth messengers were sent to tell of his coming. We, too, are God's messengers to the world around us. As we prepare for Christ's coming in our own homes and hearts, we need to remember to tell others of Christ's coming so that they also can be prepared and rejoice. In her song, the Blessed Mother Mary rejoices as her soul magnifies the Lord. Let us go and do likewise - Jesus will come again.

Let us Pray: Father of lights, this is a time of caring and sharing. A time for smiling and singing. A time for rejoicing in life itself. Let us open our hearts fully to others. Let our faces radiate the joy of your coming so that everyone we meet will know of you and the gift of life you bring. Help us to care for others and to share the good news. **Amen.**

THE LESSONS

A READING FROM THE PROPHET ISAIAH

Isaiah 35:1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing.

The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God.

Strengthen the weak hands,
and make firm the feeble knees.
Say to those who are of a fearful heart,
"Be strong, do not fear!
Here is your God.
He will come with vengeance,
with terrible recompense.
He will come and save you."

And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion with singing;

everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

Eucharistic Prayer B, BCP 367

The Lord be with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give him thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. [Proper Preface is added]

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power, of power and might Heaven and earth are full of your glory (repeat) Hosanna in the highest, Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord (repeat) Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power, of power and might; Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. Amen.
