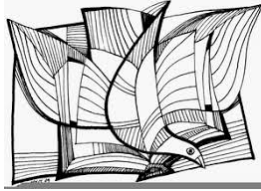

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, “Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **Amen.**

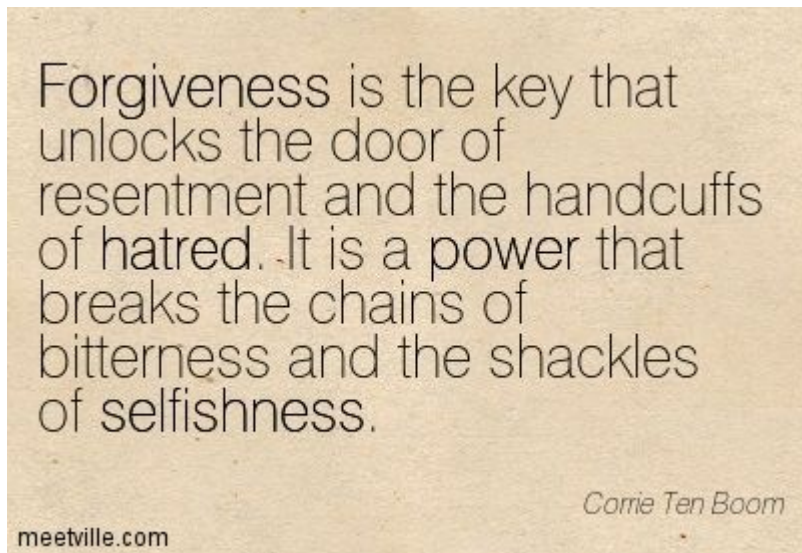

Is there someone you need to forgive this week?

Corrie ten Boom knew something about forgiveness. During WWII she and her family, who were religious Dutch Calvinists, harbored over 800 Jews in their “safe house” to protect them from arrest by the Gestapo. They were betrayed by a fellow Dutch citizen and imprisoned in concentration camps. Corrie survived and after the war and returned to the Netherlands where she set up a rehabilitation center for concentration camp survivors. In the Christian spirit to which she was so devoted, Carrie forgave and also took in those who had cooperated with the Germans during the occupation, including the Dutch citizen who betrayed her family. She later told her story in a book entitled *The Hiding Place*, which was made into a movie.

Are there people in your life whom you need to forgive - not just for their sake but for the sake of your own soul and well-being? As you go out from these walls into the world, take a little forgiveness with you and spread it to others.
